Whilst our regular Zoom meetings have been successful in terms of presenter quality & subject matter as well as significant audience interaction, it's great to be back for a weekend in Canterbury where we can both socialise together & share our JFKA knowledge, and develop our expertise in a formal learning environment. I hope that you all have a very

enjoyable weekend, and post the event, will be motivated to further develop your understanding of the JFKA or undertake specific research and share your findings at future meetings. DPUK will certainly benefit if more UK-based members present their research over the next year, whether remotely, in-person or in print in our anticipated 2023 jumbo edition of the DPUK Echo earmarked to acknowledge the sixtieth anniversary.

Once again we are fortunate to have a fantastic line-up of researchers and/or JFKA authors to present material to us or to be formally interviewed on a wide variety of subjects. They are drawn from our own membership, or researchers who have traditionally had a long-standing relationship with DPUK, such as Larry Hancock and Russell Kent. Furthermore, we have "new kids on the block" – DPUK members Johnny Cairns and Scott Reid, who have been very active in recent years in terms of presentations, published books or articles and are sharing their research and insight, all be it remotely, for the first time at Canterbury.

I would also like to specifically mention Project JFK/CSI Dallas, a US-based research group founded by Casey Quinlan, Brian Edwards and David Knight. In recent years, this group has hosted in-person and virtual conferences, as well as regular Zoom meetings in either a loose talk format attended by renowned researchers and billed as "The Journey" series, or the "Spotlight' series where respected individual researchers present their specific material more formally. Their website is www.projectjfk.com. There has been increased collaboration with DPUK over the last couple of years and I am very pleased that the three founders are remotely presenting at our seminar for the first time this year.

Below are a few specific comments on all of our speakers and interviewees and what to expect:

Bart Kamp, is a highly respected researcher and a DPUK committee member, who has devoted an incredible amount of time to developing the DPUK website, including the scanning and uploading of vast quantity of documents from Malcolm Blunt's personal collection. This DPUK website archive is being utilised by researchers all over the world and is regularly referred to in forums and podcasts. Don't underestimate the man-hours involved in this project in which Bart has introduced a new context for supermarket "bags for life"! Bart will be discussing the latest version of his Anatomy Papers which he recently

published on his website www.prayer-man.com and also conducting a Q&A with Malcolm Blunt as part of his ongoing series of interviews with Malcolm.

Dave O Brien, is a quite unique researcher in that he was able to access the TSBD in the late 70s. Following a long career as a journalist, in recent years, Dave has published two JFKA books, one as co-author with our own Johnny Cairns. I will be interviewing Dave with a focus on his early experiences as a researcher, his conclusions on the assassination and what's new in his JFK research. As part of our Project JFK/ CSI Dallas founders' section we welcome; Casey Quinlan, history teacher and long-standing JFKA researcher and author, who will be giving us an overview of the men and institutions involved in the JFKA, Brian Edwards, ex police offer and renowned JFKA researcher and author who will be discussing the tactical ambush in Dealey Plaza and David Knight, who has collaborated with many researchers in producing written material or videos, and who will be considering the "throat shot" and revisiting it with new technology.

Larry Schnapf, an environmental attorney and regular contributor to Project JFK/ CSI Dallas' "The Journey" series, will be outlining his team's efforts to push for JFKA records releases, and will include the historical context, where we stand today and what the future holds.

Malcolm Blunt, should need no introduction as a leading, internationally recognised, JFKA researcher and long-standing member of DPUK, but for those of you who don't know the extent of his contribution, he has devoted a considerable amount of his life to retrieving documents at NARA and other places in The States, worked with other eminent researchers and is considered an expert on the CIA. He will be continuing his series of interviews with Bart Kamp in a Q&A session.

Scott Reid, is one of our Scottish members who has dug deep into peripheral aspects of JFKA, contributed to the DPUK Echo and visited Dallas & the surrounding areas. He has had articles published on respected JFKA websites, presented on-line and will be analysing William Duff.

Johnny Cairns, is also one of our Scottish members who has developed an international reputation as a leading JFKA researcher with articles and podcast appearances and as a co-author of "JFK Case Not Closed". He will be discussing the Tippit murder in an interview with myself.

A warm welcome back to researcher and author Russell Kent who last featured at Canterbury in 2017. This summer he published "JFK Medical Betrayal: Where The Evidence Lies" and will be updating us on the medical evidence.

Paul Brown is a long standing DPUK member and a regular presenter at our in-person seminars. He has been doing research into The Paines and will be presenting his findings. This is good timing as Max Good has recently released a documentary entitled "The Assassination & Mrs Paine".

And last but not least, long-standing DPUK friends from across the pond, battle-hardened researchers, Larry Hancock and David Boylan will be joining us again. Larry is the author of multiple books on the assassination and other aspects of US history and has worked with David for a number of years. They will be discussing the make-up of Lee Harvey Oswald with a focus on New Orleans. Larry's website is www.larry-hancock.com

CONTRIBUTOR PROFILES




Bart Kamp

Bart was caught with 'the virus' in the late 70's seeing a BBC documentary when about to become a teenager. He has been studying the case since the release of JFK The Movie, and started to read the books of Jim Garrison and Jim Marrs shortly after the release of the film.

His first search string in the Excite search engine in 1995 was "Fletcher Prouty", and he became an avid reader of the JFK Assassination on the internet, a few years after that he went

on hiatus for more than ten years after which he started to read many more books concerning the investigation and became an avid collector of any type of media covering his main interest which steers towards inside and around the TSBD and Oswald's timeline of Nov 22nd-Nov 24th. Bart will be giving us an update on The Anatomy Papers.

Malcolm Blunt



Malcolm is known in the assassination research community for his encyclopaedic knowledge of the JFK records held at the National Archives II in College Park, MD. He was the 1998 recipient of JFK Lancer's New Frontier Award in appreciation for his contribution of new evidence in furthering the study of the assassination of President Kennedy. He also received the Pioneer Award in 2016 and the Legacy Award in 2001. The Mary Ferrell Foundation interviewed him at the Washington-based AARC conference in November 2005. He has been a member of DPUK for many years and has attended many of these seminars. He has been

guided by the idea that it's not necessarily what's in NARA that's interesting - but what's missing.

Malcolm is a BACS accredited counsellor who has recently retired after 32 years working in psychiatric rehabilitation. His interest in the JFK assassination commenced following a stop in Dallas on a U.S coach tour in 1987. In 1993 he attended his first conference and thereafter spent time researching at the Dallas Municipal Archives and later on at the National Archives; his focus right now is trying to get an understanding of historical CIA systems, organisation, and working methods.

Dave O'Brien



Dave began studying the assassination as a teenager, reading the Warren Commission Report and its 26 volumes in 1965. Over multiple decades as a researcher, key highlights have been establishing a dialogue with Dr Malcolm Perry from 1968 to 1972 and being granted rare access to the TSBD in 1979. Dave is a retired journalist who has written multiple articles on the JFKA for The Mississauga Times, covered the HSCA hearings and spoken at many JFKA seminars over the decades. In 2019, he authored "Through The 'Oswald' Window" and in 2022, he co-authored "JFK Case Not Closed".

Casey Quinlan



Casey was born and raised in the greater Kansas City area and has been a high school American History and Government teacher for the past 40 years. He served in the U.S. Army with the 9th Infantry as a combat medical corpsman during the Vietnam War. In 1991, Mr. Quinlan was a guest historian for the A&E Network and the History Channel for Oliver Stone's blockbuster movie, JFK.

Casey has been studying the murder of President Kennedy for more than 50 years and has read more than 1,250 books and publications about this National Tragedy. He has been a featured lecturer at the JFK Lancer National Conference since 2004. Mr. Quinlan received the JFK Lancer 2011 and 2012 "New Frontier Award" for continued efforts to write and inform students of the truth behind the murder of JFK.

Brian Edwards



In 1971, Brian read Mark Lane's book, Rush to Judgement (1966) and immediately became "hooked". Since then, he has accumulated and read over 600 books relating to the assassination.

In the five decades since, he has met and interviewed many of the Dealey Plaza eyewitnesses. Most notably; Jean Hill, Mary Moorman, Beverly Oliver, Bill and Gayle Newman, Buell Wesley Frazier, Ernest Brandt, Malcolm Summers, Charles Brehm, Marilyn and Linda Willis, Wayne Hartman, Toni Foster, James Tague and Ed Hoffman. His dear friend and fellow law enforcement colleague, Ian Griggs introduced him to many of the officers from of the Dallas Police Department and Dallas Sheriff's Department, most

significantly; Detectives Jim Leavelle, L. C. Graves, Sgt. Stavis Ellis, patrolmen Leonard Jez, Joe Poe, and Hollis McLain. In 1990, he interviewed Special Agent James Hosty and in 2010, he met with and interviewed Special Agent Clinton Hill of the Secret Service. He has given over 100 presentations on the JFK assassination covering a wide variety of topics and has been asked to speak at each JFK Lancer National conference since 1994.

From 1978 to 2001, Brian served as a police officer with the Lawrence Kansas Police Department. During his career with the department he served as field training officer; firearms instructor and was the department's senior crime scene photographer. From 1983 to 1991, he was assigned to the departments Crisis Response Team (SWAT) and served as a team leader for the entry team from 1986 to 1991. In 1991, he won a spot on the department's elite counter-sniper team where he served until retirement in 2001.

Brian is co-author of "Beyond the Fence Line: The Eyewitness Account of Ed Hoffman and the Murder of President John Kennedy". In 2019, he collaborated with Oliver Stone and appeared in the documentary, "JFK Revisited: Though the Looking Glass". Brian is currently writing the Roscoe White story with renowned researcher J. Gary Shaw.

David J. Knight



David Knight was born in Kansas City and graduated from Olathe South High School and, has been researching the JFK assassination since 1989. He made his first visit to Dealey Plaza in 1991. Since that time he has been to Dealey Plaza over 25 times, and interviewed eyewitnesses, authors, and researchers. He has read over 400 books on the case, and has made eleven documentaries. Mr. Knight has been a collaborator of other researchers and author's works. He has given numerous presentations to high school and college students throughout the midwest on the assassination since 1993. Mr. Knight has been involved with

Project JFK since 1991. In 1994, he and Marina Oswald were interviewed on local television during a national assassination conference in Olathe Kansas. In 2010, he became the videographer/producer for JFK Lancer's national conference held each year in Dallas Texas. In 2015, in association with William Matson Law and Debra Conway, he produced the film The Gathering, a research video detailing the accounts of the medical personnel who participated in the autopsy of President Kennedy. Mr. Knight produced a 90-minute DVD and a 9-hour box set for the second printing of the book, In The Eye Of History by William Matson Law.

Scott Reid



Scott Reid is a lifelong resident of Glasgow, Scotland and has had a keen interest in the JFK assassination since the mid 1980s. He made his first trip to Dealey Plaza in 1996 and returned in 2013 for the 50th anniversary of the assassination. Scott returned to Dallas every year since then until Covid interrupted all our lives. In recent years, he began developing his own research and presented at the JFK Lancer Virtual Conference in 2020 and 2021. Scott has also contributed articles for the Kennedys and King website, Garrison magazine and our own DPUK journal. He continues to read and research the JFK assassination when not at the day job in Glasgow, and also has an interest in the other high profile political assassinations of the 1960s, including MLK Jr and RFK.

Johnny Cairns

Johnny lives in Edinburgh, Scotland. His father, Robert Cairns, got him interested in the life and death of JFK. With respect to the JFKA, Johnny has focused on the flawed and circumstantial evidence against Lee Harvey Oswald. Johnny has presented at JFKA conferences, written articles that have been published online and co-authored "JFK Case Not Closed" which was published in 2022.

Russell Kent



Russell has an honours degree from the University of London in physiology, which describes how the anatomy and systems of the body function to keep us alive. Shortly after graduating, he joined the Laboratory of Applied Physiology in St Thomas's Hospital Medical School and became a published scientist. In the 1980s, he set up a consulting company offering writing and training services to many of the world's largest healthcare companies. This experience has allowed him to understand a complex area of evidence and present it so that readers will better understand the reality of what happened to JFK. He has been writing and speaking about the assassination for over 30 years and in fact, published several papers, made podcast

appearances and in the summer of 2022, published "JFK Medical Betrayal: Where The Evidence Lies" in which he closely scrutinises the autopsy debacle and the medical review panels.



PAUL BROWN

Paul has been interested in the assassination since his youth when he was introduced to the subject during the 30th anniversary. He has a degree in politics from The Open University and works in local government. As a member of DPUK since 2008 he has given presentations at Canterbury on various issues including the deaths of witnesses, the Dal-Tex building and the audio/visual evidence. He believes there was a conspiracy that most likely involved the same people linked to the CIA/Mafia plots against Fidel Castro.

LARRY HANCOCK



Larry is a graduate of the University of New Mexico with a BA in Education and majors in Anthropology, Sociology and Education. Following service in the United States Air Force, he worked in the telecommunications and computer communications fields for some 35 years.

He became involved with Kennedy assassination research in the early 1990's, and has focused on intelligence and national security aspects of the conspiracy. He has published a variety of document collections and analysis on CD with JFK Lancer, contributed articles and essays to Lancer, DPUK, and the Mary Ferrell Foundation. His first book, with Connie Kritzberg (former

Dallas reporter) was "November Patriots", a "docufiction" piece on the Kennedy Assassination. His second book, "Someone Would Have Talked", a factual study of the Kennedy conspiracy and cover-up is now in its third (2010) edition. Larry was also one of the authors who contributed to the DPUK book published in 2013, "JFK: Echoes from Elm Street". In 2016 he published a book entitled "Surprise Attack: From Pearl Harbour to 9/11" – covering 60 years of terrorist threats against the USA. In recent years, Larry has authored "In Denial: Secret Wars with Air Strikes and Tanks?" (2020) and "Tipping Point" (2021). He has co-led multiple conferences in Dallas.

David Boylan



David describes himself as a long-standing citizen researcher. He is the author of "A League of Their Own – Inside the Christian Defense League". He is the co-author with Larry Hancock of "The Wheaton Lead – An Exploration" and the "Red Bird Airport Leads".
